All students are learning independence skills with shoes and jackets. Students are practicing their names and starting to print. If we can have parents and guardians support this name practice writing at home, it will help your child write their name on their very own faster.

We have support for speech that can be utilized for all students if you feel your child needs some extra practice with sounds and vocabulary. Attendance is very important in helping children have a successful learning year.
