Summer Boredom Busters for busy kids

It is hard to believe that summer break is almost here. While it's fun to have no school, some days can get long -The kids may complain that they are bored and we may feel our patience wearing thin.

On those days, having some engaging activities for the kids is our best strategy to prevent challenging behaviour.

Screens are very engaging for children and there's nothing wrong with some lazy screen time here and there, but we also want to encourage our children to go outside, soak up the sun and burn off some energy. This will improve their mood, will help them sleep better and allow them to have fun with others face-to-face.

Coming up with some ideas and preparing some activities ahead of time will make the "I'm so bored" days much easier for everyone! You could even come up with a bunch of ideas (your whole family could brainstorm together), write them down on little pieces of paper and stuff them in an "I'm bored jar". Then, on days when the kids are whiny, they can pull out an idea and have some fun with it.

Here are some ideas to get you started:

Make your own sidewalk chalk paint: Mix equal parts of cornstarch and water. Divide the mixture into a muffin tin. Add some drops of food colouring, stir it up and let them paint!

Freeze some toys:

Find some little toys, add them to a bowl of water. Freeze the bowl overnight. Pop out the frozen surprise and let them dig out treasures with spoons.

Homemade bubbles:

Mix 1 cup water with 2 tablespoons of corn syrup and 4 tablespoons of dish soap.
